

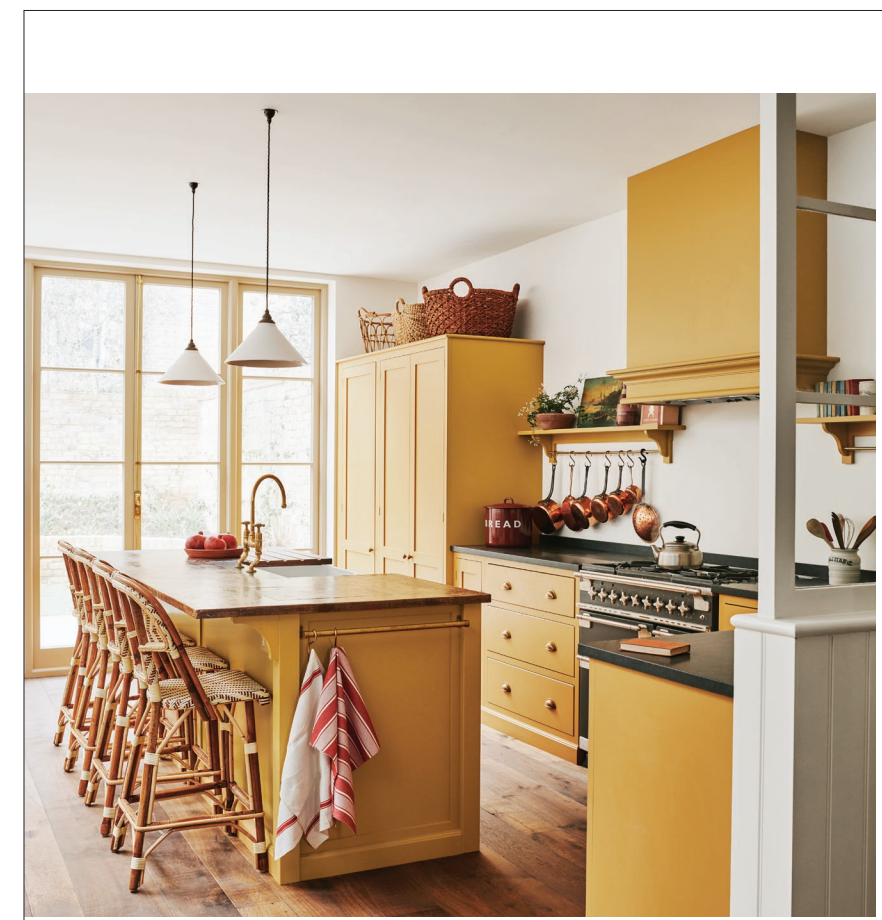


Walking on Sunshine

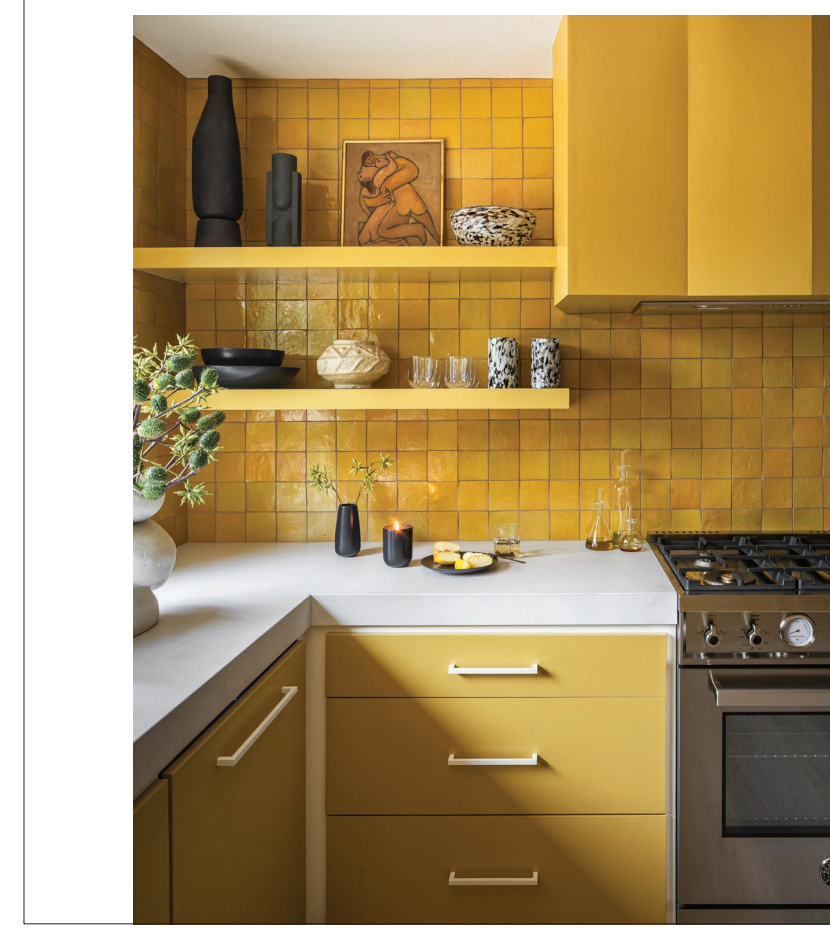
We're making the call: Sun-soaked, buttery yellows are the new "it" color for kitchen cabinets. See how designers are using them in a range of hues and finishes.

CLEAN & CLASSIC
Even when it's raining outside this Portland, OR, kitchen by Reath Design, buttery yellow cabinets (Benjamin Moore Golden Hills) bring a big dose of sunshine inside. Sepia wood tones on the floors and island act as palate cleansers between the swaths of yellow.

SHAKER SIMPLICITY
The warmth of mustard yellow envelops this London kitchen. Interior designer Natasha Quick paired the deVOL Scullery Yellow cabinetry with dark wood and black countertops, creating a cozy, utilitarian feel.



MIXED MODERN
This dynamic kitchen by Hommeboys Interiors is drenched in yellow hues; textural differences create interest. Sleek, flat-panel cabinets (painted in Dylan by Portola Paints) contrast with the irregular zellige tile backsplash. A faceted range hood adds a sculptural note.
